


# 2017 Legislative Report






# Q1: Where are you located (City, Island, State)?







# **BSH Report**





Bright Smiles Hawaii (BSH), an initiative of HPHA, was established in 2016 with a \$150,800 grant from the DentaQuest Foundation.

Mission to broaden the dialogue on oral health issues among federal agencies, state organizations, and community partners to integrate perspectives, bridging cultural oral health issues, barriers, and strategies.

### **Accomplishments:**

- Established Oral Health Disparities Community Advisory Network which includes representatives from the DOH and DOE, among others.
- Four Community Innovation Awards have been granted in oral health outreach, education, and information gathering in at-risk communities.
- BSH website provides resources and information about BSH and OH in Hawaii www.brightsmileshawaii.org.
- BSH's statewide OH Disparities Survey resulted in over 700 surveys; analysis and reporting is available on our website.

Through BSH, HPHA strives to improve the public perception of the value of oral health to overall health.

- Work focuses on the neediest, most at-risk and disadvantaged populations.
- Overall goal is to support a more inclusive and responsive collaboration that will result in better oral health outcomes for ALL residents of Hawaii.






