National Stakeholder Strategy for Achieving Health Equity

- Roadmap for eliminating health disparities through cooperative and strategic actions
- Leads to Regional Blueprints for Action
- 20 strategies to promote systematic and systemic change
- Closely aligned with Healthy People 2020

National Stakeholder Strategy for Achieving Health Equity

- Establishes Regional Health Equity Councils (RHEC)
- Each RHEC = 35 leaders and catalysts for strengthening health equity actions — membership representative of all racial and ethnic groups and stakeholders addressing social-determinants of health
- Region IX Council: 2 from Hawaii and 1 from Guam
- Next meeting: OCT 24-25 in San Francisco, CA

HHS Plan for White House Initiative on Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders (WHIAAPI)

- WHIAAPI required all depts. to submit a plan
- Final HHS plan submitted in JAN 2011
- Four main priority areas:
 - Implement strategic plan to prevent/treat/control Hep B among AANHPIs
 - Work to improve reporting of data for AANHPIs
 - Foster health-related workforce development
 - Address some of the critical health issues that impact NHPI populations

"Address some of the critical health issues that impact NHPI populations"

- OMH and Office on Women's Health compiling catalogue of Pacific "Promising Practices" for NCD prevention
- 167 practices collected to date from the USAPI
- Currently reviewing and editing the catalogue
- Submitted as part of the HHS WHIAAPI Plan
- Posted on Web in the foreseeable future
- Catalogue will be updated periodically

New Data Collection Standards

- On Oct. 31, 2011 HHS published final standards for data collection on race, ethnicity, sex, primary language and disability status, as required by Section 4302 of the Affordable Care Act
- Standards apply to population health surveys sponsored by HHS, where respondents either selfreport information or a knowledgeable person responds for all members of a household
- Effective for all new surveys and at the time of major revisions to current surveys

New Data Collection Standards

- Previously 2 categories for the Pacific:
 - Native Hawaiian
 - Other Pacific Islander
- Now:
 - Native Hawaiian
 - Guamanian or Chamorro
 - Samoan
 - Other Pacific Islander
