Tobacco-Free Beaches, Parks, and Recreational Facilities

April 22, 2008:

Hawai'i County is the first in the State to prohibit tobacco-use at ALL Hawai'i County-owned parks, beaches and recreational facilities.

Why Smoke-Free Parks & Beaches?

#1: Eliminate secondhand smoke (Class-A Carcinogen), known to cause cancer.

Outdoor tobacco smoke is known to be as toxic as indoor SHS, which negatively affects youth and adults with asthma, emphysema, and heart conditions.



#2: Toxic Unsightly Litter:

Cigarette butts and tobacco packaging are the number one litter problem on our beaches.

- Ingesting cigarette butts is harmful to our children, coastal birds and marine life.
- Toxins from cigarette butts leach in the ground and ocean.



#3: Changing societal acceptance of tobacco use:

Everyday 3,000 youth become newly addicted tobacco users

Youth get mixed messages about tobacco use.

"Do as I say, not as I do."

RESEARCH: Island-wide?

Sept. 2007: TFBI started its Community Assessment for an island-wide initiative conducted at the County Fair and health fairs.

ACTION STEPS:

Clean the Beach! The more butts the better!



- Youth & adults collected 1,500Butts in 40 minute sweep
- Beach cleanedjust 4 days prior

And MORE Action Steps:

- Action Alerts
- T-Shirts
- Letters to the Editor
- Classroom Talks
- Information Fliers
- Collecting Signatures



Month Three: The Final Stretch

- Bill 224 Passes 2nd Reading
- Mayor Vetoes Bill
- Council overrides veto and Bill 224 Passes on April 22nd 2008 "Earth Day"

AND.... Ordinance No.08-56

- Effective immediately
- Use of all tobacco products is prohibited at all County-owned parks and recreational facilities
- Includes parking lots, NO ACCOMMODATIONS
- Violators fined up to \$100 & enforcement by police
- · Does not specify minimum signage requirement.



Moderately Agree 13,377 20.8%



Smoke-Free Cars:

August 8, 2010:

• Hawai'i County is the first in the State to prohibit smoking in ALL vehicles whenever occupied by a person less than 18 years of age.

The Fast & Furious...

- Introduced by Hawaii County
 Vice Chair Emily Na'ole
- Moved quickly through introduction, 1st & 2nd reading
- Passed in June 2010
- Signed into law Hawaii County
 Ordinance No. 10-33 August
 2010



Bill 260 Became Law

Hawai'i County prohibits smoking in any motor vehicle whenever occupied by a person less than eighteen years of age:

- Automatic court appearance
- Violation on driving record
- Fines up to \$50.00

Implementation: MEDIA & Youth

•Partnered with Waiakea High School's marketing program. Seniors to create multiple radio PSA's

- •Created partnership with Hawaii County Police
- Youth driven presentations

1st Anniversary of SF Vehicles

- Island Wide Art Contest with over 200 pieces of artwork from grades K-12
- Awarded at Hawaii County
 Smoke-Free Fair
- Using artwork in collateral education tools

In Hindsight

- Careful of who to ask for help from - not everyone was in step.
- Include a 3-month effective date, allow for education.
- Specific signage requirements
- Youth athletic Organizations
